



Mentoring Bootcamp: Bridging the economic divide, exploring possibility of livelihoods for rural women in BFSI (Banking, Finance and Insurance sector)

Organised by - SANI Mumbai and Red Dot Foundation with rural women from Maharashtra

Summary/description of the event:

An interactive online mentoring bootcamp with *Digital Entrepreneurs - (rural women trained on imparting Digital Financial Literacy to the rural - urban community)*. This was a "peer mentoring" bootcamp where we learnt from each other through sharing challenges.

Flow of the project:

The project was in three parts. The opening session, the mentoring and capacity building sessions and the final closing session. We invited SANI members, interested mentors and Swedish companies to participate.

Outcomes	Understanding challenges of rural women and their learning from the Digital Entrepreneurs program. Group Discussion: one to one with each Digital Entrepreneur to talk about one obstacle faced by her (personal or professional depending upon her comfort level) and gathering solutions or finding a solution to address it.	Identification of mentors from Swedish Alumni, Mumbai for Digital Entrepreneurs (mentorship for 3 months minimum). Mentoring relationships which benefit both parties. Network of solidarity and action.	Networking and access to a broader support system for the Digital Entrepreneurs. Through skills gained in mentorship program increase in employability in the BFSI sector as well as creating aspirations to become entrepreneurs.
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The following were the activities conducted:

- 1. **Liaising** with AFARM for 10 Rural Digital Entrepreneurs (RDE). Initially we planned to host 8 RDEs in the program but finally involved 10 RDEs because of their passion and commitment.
- 2. **Three sessions on Art of Storytelling** for the Rural Digital Entrepreneurs (RDE) before the opening session so that they could maximise the opportunity during the program. This was facilitated by Ms. Supreet K Singh, Director & CEO of Red Dot Foundation and conducted in Hindi.
- 3. One prep workshop for the facilitators and mentors for the Bootcamp on 24 July.
- 4. **Opening Session on 24 July 2021** had close to 70+ registrations out of which close to 60 turned out. There were 10 Sakhis (digital rural women entrepreneurs) from an NGO based in Pune called AFARM (works in the space of sustainable livelihoods for the marginalised). The RDEs shared their personal stories and then they were assigned to breakout rooms with participants in the audience. In the breakout rooms, the RDEs posed their challenges and the discussion was facilitated by Swedish Institute Alumni. Final harvesting of feedback in the main session.

- 6. **Mentoring sessions** Each RDE was paired with a senior woman leader from the private or development sector. Every fortnight for three months, the RDE and her mentor met for a one hour mentoring session. Some feedback and testimonies from the mentoring sessions are below.
- 7. Closing session on 23 October 2021 We had close to 50 people who attended the session. Ms. Anna Lekvall, Consul General, Consulate General of Sweden in Mumbai gave the opening address. Each RDE and her mentor shared their experiences from the program.

Shubhangi Hulsure - Kshiti Gala

I have been a part of this project for a while now. I have learnt so much from how to increase the number of customers to marketing to understanding how my business will grow if I do my best. And I saw the results as more customers started coming to me through word of mouth. I learnt everything about how to use computers and business. I know these are the lessons I will endure for the rest of my life. Sabir sir held classes that helped me a lot. With my mentor, Kshiti ma'am I never felt like an employee-employer relationship, I can proudly call her my older sister today. Everyone felt like a family and treated me with such warmth and respect. It gave me the comfort to communicate my queries with them. This helped me a lot to stay confident with my work. I can't believe that an ordinary girl from a small village is now an entrepreneur. Big thanks to Rashmi ma'am, Supreet ma'am, Jyoti ma'am, Sabir sir and Kshiti ma'am.

Tabbu - Beroz

I've got the opportunity to learn from this project. And you have explained everything to us in such an easy form that it will be impactful for the rest of my life. Supreet ma'am lent me her ears and paid attention to our difficulties and so taught me that no matter what happens in my life I will not give up, that I will never give into the reality of life, I will create my own. Beroz ma'am has also taught me about investments, marketing, customer service and has paid attention to the smaller details of how to get the business going. How to interact with customers from the ones





who talk rudely to the good customers. I have also learnt how to solve difficulties. She also attempted to teach me English, I am still trying to get there and be more regular with it. Thanks to Jyoti and Beroz for that. I learnt so much more from Sabir sir in one session, more than I could ever learn in the past one year through my computer classes. I have got the opportunity to learn so much that I will not only utilise these lessons for business but also in my personal life. Thank you for thinking I was capable of this.

For the past two and a half months, I've been a part of this program. First thing I learnt was how to speak in Hindi, and so I got the opportunity to tell my story. From this project I learnt so much about how to market my business and serve the community. I couldn't find a place to set up my business, so Soma ma'am got me a place by talking to the head of the village. This helped me a lot. I faced many challenges -- how to set up my business and connect people through whatsapp, but everything was taken care of by the team. Everyone helped me out, especially Jyoti ma'am when I missed my sessions for personal reasons. The information I have gathered from this program will help me in the future as well. I am very thankful to everyone. Thank you so much!

Results and Outcomes

- This project demonstrated the need for longer sessions and also a more sustained investment in RDEs.
- The RDEs found the capacity building and mentoring sessions useful. They were not only provided with knowledge and skills but also an ecosystem of support.
- The Mentors were provided with perspectives beyond their lived reality and a deeper understanding of the challenges faced by rural women in India.
- Mentoring programs have long-lasting effects greater self-confidence in the RDE, confidence in speaking Hindi and rudimentary English and motivation to aspire for larger goals.

Sustainability of the project

- The RDEs will be part of the alumni network of Red Dot Foundation and have access to further capacity building sessions.
- Many of the mentors have expressed an interest to continue the mentoring relationship.
