Welcome to our Safecity Data Dashboard!
We hope this will help you understand key insights about violence in your community.

This dashboard is the outcome of more than 50000 reports made through the Safecity platform that crowdsources personal stories of sexual harassment and abuse in public and private spaces. This data, which is anonymous, gets aggregated as hot spots on a map indicating trends at a local level. Our hope is that this data becomes useful for individuals, communities and institutions to identify factors that cause behavior that lead to violence and work on strategies for solutions.

Gender Based Violence is an ongoing pandemic. To fight it, Red Dot Foundation aims to make cities safer by encouraging equal access to public and private spaces for everyone, especially women and girls through the use of crowdsourced data, community engagement and institutional accountability.

Through the anonymous data collected on the Safecity platform, Red Dot Foundation Group:

Creates awareness on sexual harassment and abuse

Collates information to showcase location based trends

Makes information available and useful for individuals, communities and institutions to solve the problem at the local level

Builds community leadership to encourage social and systemic change


We believe in the power of speaking up and breaking the patriarchal culture of silence. Together we can make more cities safer.






Was the incident reported to the police?
